Introduction.

Section 337 Investigations by the International Trade Commission (ITC) have become increasingly popular in the past decades due to globalization, leading to a surge in imported goods and IP-related risks. These investigations offer expedited proceedings, typically completed within 12 to 15 months, and authority over accused products rather than individuals or entities. This simplifies the process for addressing IP disputes and enables successful complainants to obtain exclusion orders enforced by U.S. Customs and Border Protection, thus safeguarding American innovation and industry against IP infringement.

In 2023, there was a notable decrease in new investigations under the ITC Section 337 after several consecutive years of increase. The recent decline necessitates a separate analysis as it can result from various factors. In this report, we will analyze the average duration of investigations, addressing concerns that the increasing duration might deter the filing of new complaints. Despite this, several large law firms, including Am Law 100 firms, are adding and expanding their ITC practice within their intellectual property groups by hiring more ITC attorneys. Some firms, which have been active on the complainant side, are more actively utilizing the ITC as a strategic avenue to increase their chances of success.

What's New in the 2024 ITC Intelligence Report?

The 2024 ITC Intelligence Report introduces two updates and enhancements aimed at providing a more comprehensive view of ITC Section 337 Investigations and all stakeholders involved. Last year our efforts included refining our ranking methodology, incorporating CAFC appeals data, and analyzing investigation durations. This year, we offer a deeper analysis of investigation duration by outcome and include data from the ITC

regarding investigations initiated by non-practicing entities (NPEs).

Our objective is to deliver a more accurate and reliable measure of the success of ITC Section 337 Investigations, achieved through several adjustments and normalizations based on community feedback. The following summarizes the updates and changes made.

Investigation Duration Analysis

Analyzing investigation duration is crucial as it provides insights into the efficiency and effectiveness of the ITC Section 337 process. Understanding how long investigations typically take can help stakeholders man-

age expectations, allocate resources more effectively, and identify potential areas for improvement in the investigative process. By categorizing investigations based on their outcomes, we can offer a better understand-

ing of how duration fluctuates based on the resolution type of disputes. This allows for a deeper analysis of factors influencing inves-

tigation length and provides insights into the likelihood of different outcomes based on the time taken to resolve cases.

Non-Practicing Entities Initiating Investigations

Over the last six years, from 2018 to 2023, the trends in Section 337 investigations initiated by Non-Practicing Entities (NPEs) have exhibited fluctuations. Understanding these trends is essential as it sheds light on the evolving strategies and activities of

NPEs within the ITC landscape. Analyzing the changes in the number of investigations brought by NPEs over this period provides insights into their impact on intellectual property disputes and the overall dynamics of the ITC Section 337 process.

What's in the Pipeline for 2024?

As our Intelligence Reports enter its eighth year of publication, these annual reports have garnered widespread popularity among corporations and law firms. A Google search for "patexia rankings" yields thousands of pages published by law firms online, utilizing our reports and data-driven rankings for marketing and business development across various domains of intellectual property (IP).

Our District Court Patent Litigation Report was released in late January, and our upcoming report on Patent Prosecution, currently in preparation, is scheduled for release in March. All these reports are offered free of charge to our Concierge Members.

We have made significant progress by introducing newly designed pages dedicated to attorneys, firms, and companies, providing diverse statistics and insights on each. Additionally, we have launched new pages focusing on patents, cases, and trademarks, enriching our platform with comprehensive data and analysis across various aspects of intellectual property. What's in This Report?

The report is divided into the following sections:

- 1 **ITC Statistics:** This section offers a comprehensive overview of ITC investigations and covers high-level statistics concerning the ITC, encompassing all parties, judges, and cases from January 1, 2018, through December 31, 2023.
- 2 Complainants and Respondents: This section identifies the most active and bestperforming Complainants and Respondents throughout the study period.
- 3 Law Firms: This section analyzes the performance and activity of law firms, providing comparisons and rankings for the top firms representing Complainants and Respondents.
- 4 Attorneys: This section reviews the performance and activity of attorneys representing complainants and respondents, offering comparisons and rankings for the top attorneys on each side. It also includes signifi-

- cant lateral moves over the past year, along with the law firms that experienced growth and decline in the number of ITC attorneys.
- 5 Administrative Law Judges: This section analyzes the performance of Administrative Law Judges (ALJs) during the study period, evaluating the outcomes of their judgments across all investigations.
- 6 Ranking Methodology: This section explains the performance model and how the performance scores and rankings for Complainants, Respondents, their representatives, and ALJs were calculated.

As per tradition for our ITC report and our other intelligence reports, and in order to have a meaningful comparison, as well as compensate for the time required for each case from filing to completion (e.g., 6 to 18 months), we covered a period of six years, January 1, 2018, through December 31, 2023. Appendix A lists all sources of data used for this report.

Appendix A: Sources of Data.

Data is the foundation and building block of any data-driven analysis. Therefore, collecting that data from quality sources, and taking extra care in maintaining the data integrity, is something that we at Patexia take very seriously. We have collected our raw data from many sources including:

- US ITC Investigations Database System, Section 337 Information (https://ids.usitc.gov/)
- ITC Electronic Document Information System (EDIS) (https://edis.usitc.gov/external/)
- Patent Trial and Appeal Board (PTAB) Database
- United States Patent and Trademark (USPTO) Patent Database
- Public Access to Court Electronic Records (PACER)
- Court of Appeal for the Federal Circuit (CAFC)
- US Patent Classification Database
- Self-reported by attorneys named on the case

For this release, we limited the date range of our analysis to the last six years (January 1, 2018, through December 31, 2023).

While the possibility of errors such as typos in legal documents is inevitable, cleaning and organizing the attorneys' data is even more challenging as attorneys change firms, may not update their information, and often use different variations of their names.

Our engineering team has implemented machine learning and natural language processing (NLP) methods to find the correct matches for various occurrences of the same name. To further minimize the errors, we not only review suspicious matches manually but also host profile pages for more than 100,000 attorneys and agents who can directly review and add missing cases to our database.

All the user-added data was again verified by Patexia's internal data team for accuracy.
